

On Friday, ESPN.com reported Tressel's recent comment in regards to Ohio State's recruiting process -that its inability to win was making it harder for Ohio State to recruit -- was specifically directed at former Buckeyes offensive coordinator Tom Herman. Tressel, who was Ohio State's coach during the 2011 recruiting class, was unaware of Herman's hiring at Houston until he was made aware of the report. On Friday evening, he released a statement via Twitter: "I am deeply disappointed that ESPN.com has chosen to run a story about myself without contacting me for comment. This story is untrue and has no place in the sports media. I do not intend to dignify this nonsense with any response. I will have no further comment." The story was pulled from ESPN.com shortly after it was published. Tressel's comments were made during an interview with FOX Sports Radio's Howard Eskin. In the course of discussing the college football recruiting process, Tressel said: "How can you recruit kids when you can't win? I don't understand the recruiting process where the most successful programs don't have a chance to recruit the best talent. How is that ever going to work?... You' 82157476af
